

Class IV Market News and Summary




The November Class IV price was \$13.30 /cwt. down \$0.17/cwt. from the previous month. Class IV projection for next month is \$13.30/cwt.

The November Class III price was \$23.34/cwt. up \$1.73/cwt. from the previous month. Class III projection for next month is \$15.98/cwt.

Milk production in the 24 major States during October totaled 17.7 billion pounds, up 3.1% from the previous month and up 2.5% from October 2019




The number of milk cows on farms in October in the 24 major States was 8.88 million head, up .2% from last month and up .7% from the same period in 2019,




October Production per cow in the 24 major States averaged 1,997 pounds, up 2.9% from last month and up 1.8% from the same period in 2019

MILK COWS – 24 MAJOR STATES




Butter production for October was 164.9 million pounds, 1.2 percent above October 2019 and 8.8 percent above last month

U.S. BUTTER PRODUCTION




U.S. BUTTER IN COLD STORAGE




Butter stocks for October were 300.3 million lb. down 12.7% from last month and up 28.0% from a year ago

Skim/NFDM Production



Combined Nonfat and Skim powder produced in October 2020 was 195.54 million lb. up 8.6% from October 2019 and down 1.46% from last month.

Dry milk products (comparisons in percentage with October 2019) Nonfat dry milk, human 138 million pounds, up 4.3 percent. Skim milk powder 57.2 million pounds, up 20.7 percent.





Nonfat Inventory at the end of October 2020 was 217.9 million lbs. up 7.8% October 2019 and up 0.7 % from last month
